



Jumper- Not a big deal

Glosary:

Zip: To move or go somewhere very quickly

Slacker: Showing a lack of activity; not busy or happening in a positive way **Vault:** A room, especially in a bank, with thick walls and a strong door, which is used to store money or valuable things in safe conditions

Avenger: To do harm to or punish the person responsible for something bad done to you or your family or friends in order to achieve a fair situation
